Your child may be entitled to a free school meal, if you are in receipt of any of the following benefits.

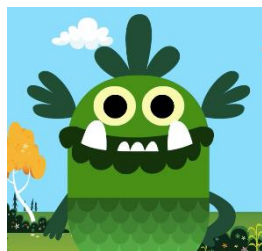
- Income Support

- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

Jewellery

In the interest of health and safety the only jewellery to be worn at school is a suitable wrist watch and stud style ear-rings. When ears have first been pierced then your child must ensure they are covered with a plaster (brought from home) during P.E, after the initial 6 week period then you child must be able to remove and replace their ear-rings independently.

Nut Allergy Information

Please be reminded that we are a nut free school. Please support us by refraining from sending items which contain nuts. This will help us to ensure the safety of particular children in the school, for whom this is a very important issue. Examples of such products being peanut butter, Nutella spread, "Healthy" fruit bars or biscuits which contain nuts. For some children even a small trace of nuts picked up on their fingertips could cause a severe reaction. Thank you for your continued support.

- **Uniform** - Black Trousers, Blue EYFS t-shirt, EYFS hoodie, Black shoes, Cap, Book bag/rucksack, Blue and white summer dress.
- **PE Kit** – White t-shirt, black shorts, black plimsolls.

Key Stage 1 & 2

- **Uniform** – Black trousers/skirt, White polo shirt (School logo style available), White and blue summer dress, Sweatshirt, black shoes, black or white socks/tights, cap, water-proof coat (School logo style available).
- **PE Kit** – Black PE Shorts, White polo P.E t-shirt, black (unbranded) tracksuit, outdoor trainers, black plimsolls (for use as required)
